SW provided an update from the last RAUCs meeting: Inspection fees for next year are already being discussed. Draft Code of Practice for Inspections to be agreed at the next meeting. Safety issues noted in Glasgow on site where a road operative was threatened with a firearm. PMac raised the issue of emergency services have the right to go through sites that are subject to road closures. The document recently circulated around the group from George Borthwick involving the death of a member of the public with the emergency services not jumping through the closure and instead getting lost on the diversion route causing delay in reaching the member of the public. SWRAUC there was an issue with bagging off permanent signals and not turning off the permanent signals. Under Chapter 8 they do not require to be switched off if the works are under 7 days but if the work is longer than 7 days they must be switched off. BT are required to provide duct and pole information to anyone that requests it. Duct sharing was raised but it was discussed how this can lead to issues with ownership of works and reinstatements. A presentation from MACS (Mobility and Access Committee Scotland) was given. The group should have received the presentation from George. There is a new version of SROH which includes narrow trenching, something SROR may look to potentially change. Graham Milne from SRWC is continuing to monitor performance. 6.0 **Matters arising from Tayforth** N/A 7.0 Other Competent Business Ineos Linewatch Presentations will take place on 16th and 17th September. Clacks currently coring their own sites prior to capital works for cold tar and updating Symology if there is cold tar present. PMac asked if there was any documentation through RAUCs regarding cold tar. There is currently nothing however Martin Polland was looking into creating documentation for it. Fire hydrants and their maintenance responsibility was discussed. GM advised that fire hydrants are maintained by SW on behalf of the fire service. The fire service must grant permission to SW before they touch the hydrant. JD raised the issue of damage to other utility apparatus and the time taken for repairs to be undertaken. Example of Livingstone Terrace, Redding was given where Clancy waited weeks for Virgin to fix damaged apparatus. BS
